Each successive year saw new agencies opened at other points throughout the South, and finally by 1872 the pension system was again in operation in every southern state. To meet the situation in 1861, Congress decided to act upon the Commissioner's recommendation. The first step taken was to ascertain exactly what laws were then in operation governing the payment of pensions. Neither the Commissioner of Pensions nor the Secretary of Interior was able to furnish the information desired; but the latter called upon attorney-general Bates for an interpretation of certain acts then

found on the statute books. He was first asked to place a construction upon the act of July 22, 1861, and in addition give an opinion upon the following points.
