How does the experience of being a professional sports person differ from the popular perceptions of fans, journalists or academics? Why might elite sports people experience mental health difficulties away from the public gaze? The book also considers how these important issues relate to broader cultural and social factors, and therefore represents important reading for any student or professional with an interest in sport psychology, coaching, sport sociology, youth sport, counselling, or exercise and mental health.

Easier Said Than Done: A Life in Sport Alan Wilkins, 2018-05-31 Turning adversity on its head he embarked upon a career in broadcasting that began in South Africa with the South African Broadcasting Corporation (SABC), before returning to Cardiff in September 1987 to anchor BBC Wales' portfolio of prime time sports programs. By the mid-1990s Alan had gone freelance and, following the end of apartheid, was reunited with the SABC to cover South Africa's return to world sport with the 1994 cricket tour to England and the 1995 Rugby World Cup. He also began what would become a long association with Singapore-based ESPN Star Sports (ESS) by commentating on the 1996 Indian cricket tour of England. By 1997 Alan had joined the ESS commentary team in India for the One Day International series between India and Sri Lanka where he was part of the commentary team, with Ravi Shastri, Sunil Gavaskar, Navjot Singh Sidhu, Harsha Bhogle and Geoffrey Boycott, otherwise known as A Few Good Men. In February 2000 he re-located to Singapore to work for ESS and for almost 16 years enjoyed broadcasting cricket, golf, rugby, tennis and a host of other sports across the Indian sub-continent. A return home to Wales in 2015 has reignited Alan's love for rugby but as you'll read in *Easier Said Than Done*, his love of sport means the shape or size of the ball is not an issue.

An Incomplete and Inaccurate History of Sport Kenny Mayne, 2008-04-22 Painstakingly faithful to its title, Kenny Mayne's book is neither complete nor is it particularly accurate. Ostensibly an A-to-Z encyclopedia of all known sports, many sports are never mentioned. There's not a word about rugby, volleyball, Roller Derby, swimming, or (shockingly) Basque pelota or shinty. There is a chapter about sliding, but none about skiing. Competitive eating and rhythmic gymnastics will have to wait for another book. However, there are roughly eight chapters about tackle football—"the greatest sport in the world, and everyone knows it"—and a good four or five about horse racing, so quit complaining before you've even read the book. There will be plenty of

time for complaining after you've finished it (about an hour from now—tops). Those sports that are covered in the book are examined with exhaustive inattention to unretained detail. Many chapters have nothing to do with sport. For instance, the chapter on hunting is about hunting for a hassle-free triple tall Americano light on the water. So, then, what exactly is this book-like thing you hold in your hands? Part nostalgic memoir (like the summer Mark Sansaver hit 843 home runs in backyard Wiffle ball), part Dave Barry-esque riffs (like explaining bocce to non-Italians), part scholarly tract (includes the origins of tackle football), and part metafiction (see "Time-outs"). . . all with illustrations drawn by Kenny's daughters, it is what Kenny calls his anti coffee-table book, or Coaster. The publisher calls it \$24.95. Reviewers like Michiko Kakutani may call it "insipid," but because Kenny has included a revolutionary "backwards" following the book's foreword, she'll have to call it an "insipid breakthrough" of a book. So what is this book-like thing? Like the great mysteries in life, you'll have to decide for yourself. *That would include a thought I just had. This thought had something to do with Wiffle ball. What a great chapter. But that's not to say the chapter on hunting is terrible even though it's mostly about coffee. Plus I wrote stuff about my children. There's even a chapter on jai alai. This book has both still photographs and still illustrations. It doesn't have any moving pictures. That would have required the inclusion of a projector and a big white screen in the book, and I'm trying to take a stand on energy conservation. Strangely enough, Ken Griffey Jr. asked me if the book would have video. This will make sense when you read the chapter on him. I wish I'd written about the Seattle Pilots. I used to go to their games when I was nine. My favorite player was Tommy Harper. But this isn't just a sports book. It covers all sorts of things. I hope they place it in the Miscellaneous section. That should draw a lot of attention. I was told that the presence of a sub-title would sell more books. How am I doing with you? Make sure to tell people about this alluring and informative sub-title. This sub-title is longer than some of my chapters.

Redefining Sports Media Jason Kido Lopez, 2023-05-29 This book argues that the examination of sports media within cultural and media studies is organized around more than just a shared topic: mediated sports. What count as sports media in journals, books, and conferences are extremely diverse; they can cover athlete expression on social media, shoe commercials, gender in sports commentary, Indigenous name change activists, and fantasy sports. Besides being mediated and, in some cases, loosely connected to sports events and leagues, it is hard to see what they all share that could serve as the foundation for a unified field of study. Jason Kido Lopez argues that sports media are defined by genre, which is reflected in their industries, within their content, and by their audiences. Throughout the media and cultural complex, sports and sports media are built on the genre of live and real competition and, therefore, to study sports media is to study that genre. In the early sixties Jimmy Stewart played a disgraced baseball player in *Flashing Spikes*-which was also one of the rare ventures into television for veteran director John Ford. On HBO the Yankees have been the subject of both *61** - about Roger Maris's quest to top Babe Ruth's home run record - and *The Bronx Is Burning*, about the 1977 Yankees team. And there have been sports-themed TV sitcoms as well, such as *Sports Night*, Aaron Sorkin's critically lauded but commercially unsuccessful project, which preceded his work on *The West Wing*. Meanwhile *American Gladiators*-a strange blend of canned programming and authentic athletic endeavor that in effect puts television audiences in an arena with what amounts to professional athletes-is quickly becoming one of the most popular shows on primetime. Here, Marill gives due time to all of these unique projects.

On the East Coast and the Midwest, people would literally rush home from church to hear what they had to say, and on the West Coast fans loved waking up to it. The NFL Today became so popular that it not only dominated the ratings, but also won its timeslot 18 straight years, from 1975 to 1993, until CBS lost its NFL package to Fox. And today, looking back, these four personalities, like any family, had their own battles, and became even more famous for them.
