He indicates how institutional analysis must be incorporated into neoclassical theory and explores the potential for the construction of a dynamic theory of long-term economic change. Douglass C. He is a past president of the Economic History Association and Western Economics Association and a Fellow, American Academy of Arts and Sciences. He has written over sixty articles for a variety of journals and is the author of The Rise of the Western World: A New Economic History (CUP, 1973, with R.P.
